









There is parking located throughout the Downtown, including several other locations. How long would you be willing to walk to your destination from a parking spot?



Which of these options do you think best meet the needs of Downtown Westport and the guiding principles for this project, shown below?




#### How important is parking located in the Parker Harding lot?



Very important - Maximize parking spaces ... Important - Emphasize parking close to m... Somewhat important - Have parking, but t... Not important - There is enough other par...



## Do you support closing Taylor Place to vehicular traffic?





#### Would you support moving parking from the current lot to these alternative locations?






#### Do you support adding a play area in front of the library?




#### Do you support a pleasure boat docking area at Jesup Green?











## Which area / neighborhood of Westport do you reside in?





#### Do you work locally or commute outside Westport?




#### Which applies to you?
